Clarke inspires with hat-trick

Parez turned from goal provider to a scorer straight from the restart and Alasaarela joined him three minutes later.

With Lightning being five in front it was time for the youngsters to get involved with 18-year-old Danny Chaplen claiming a rare goal on the 47th minute.

The more experienced players then played their part in the goal scoring front, with Adam Randmall getting on the score sheet after player-coach Nick Poole netted eight with help from Alasaarela and Aiden Mahmud.

Ross Bowers then rounded off the rampant display for Lighting four minutes from time to seal a more than convincing win.
