MK Lightning have received a double boost ahead of a busy Christmas period.

Ales Parez returned for Lightning following six long weeks on the sidelines and Greg Randell is set make his comeback this weekend.

Both players picked up their injuries back in October against Romford Raiders, the side Lightning beat 2-1 at the week-

"I'm old and I'm tired, I need the break. I also love the coaching side of my job so although it's a little frustrating, I'm still working with the team."

Poole was an onlooker during his side's win over Romford on Saturday, and believes the close score line was a little flattering to the visitors.

"It was closer than it should have been, we out shot them and outplayed them but are sharpness in front of goal wasn't

Romford were fired into a surprising lead five minutes into the first period but fans favourite Adam Carr was at hand to pull Lightning back six minutes later.

A quiet second half saw the scores remain at 1-1 despite Lightning looking the brighter side. The winner finally came midway through the final period with Toni Alasaarela blasting the puck into the net.

The win leaves MK in fourth place, eight

points behind league leaders Guildford, and Poole is looking at the next few months as the time to push on up the table.

"Christmas is always a tough time and the next six weeks that will be important. The league will start to take some shape and we need to get the results to stay right up there.
