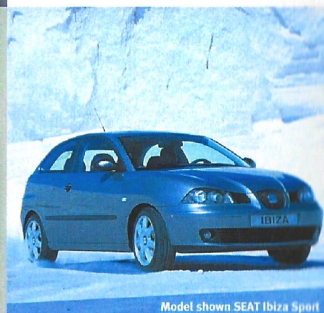

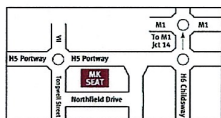

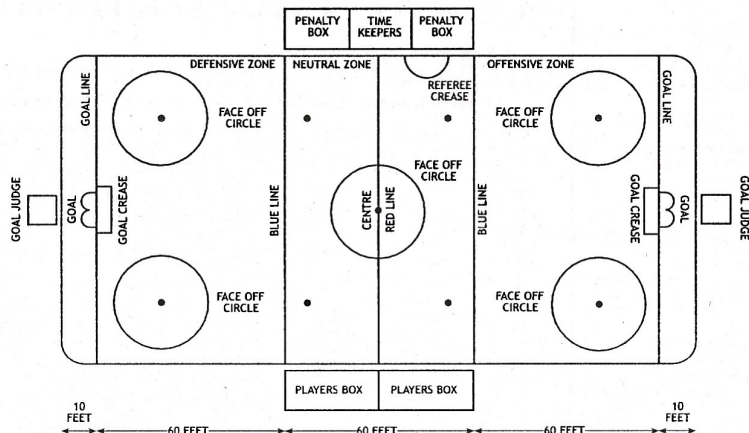

THE ARENA



Game Officials

The referee controls the game. He calls all the penalties and must decide the legality of goals, though sometimes he will call time and ask his linesmen for an opinion before he makes the final decision. The duty of the linesmen is to determine offside and icing. They drop the puck for face offs. They chase the puck after stoppage of play.

Object of the Game

The object is to score goals by putting the puck in the other team's goal whilst making sure that the other team don't do the same to you. Players can hit it with a stick or deflect it off another player including the goalie.

Rules of the Game

There are only **two** basic rules in ice hockey:

Off Side: When an attacking player crosses the defending team's blue line before the puck he is Off Side. Play is halted and a face-off is held on the nearest spot in the neutral zone.

Icing: If a defending player shoots the puck from his own half past the opposing team's goal line and the puck is next touched by an opposing player, icing is called. Play is halted and the puck is returned to the place where the pass originated.

Duration

The senior game consists of three periods of twenty minutes each. The clock stops with the action.

Scoring

A goal is legal if all of the puck crosses all of the goal-line.

EXCEPTIONS ARE:-

It's not legal however if there is an attacking player in the goal crease who is currently not held by a defender whilst his team mates score.

It is legal to score by kicking providing the puck is deflected off a defenders stick before entering the goal.

No more than two assists can be credited on any goal and these go to the players who handle the puck immediately preceding the goal.

entering the Thunderdome tonight Haringey Racers

Racers return to the thunderdome for their second visit of the season.

Last time out, they were sent back to north London, having been demolished 11-1.

Only the heroics between the pipes from Racer's Wills kept the score down as he faced a massive sixty shots, deserving his MoM award.

Racers History

Haringey Arena was built in 1936 and was the finest ice rink in Britain. It held 11,000 people in armchair seats, with perfect sighting all round and plenty of facilities. Two top ice hockey teams played out of this rink. The Racers and The Greyhounds, taking their names from the speedway and greyhound racing which took place in the adjacent Stadium.

Percy Nicklin was engaged to run the teams. He had twice won the Canadian Championship with Moncton Hawks and had taken the Olympic, World and European Championships for Great Britain. His successes and his reputation brought to Haringey some of the finest players in the world. Amongst them were defensemen Len Burrage and Bob Whitelaw, Racers' regular "blue-liners", and starry forwards Walter 'The Fox' Monson of Winnipeg Monarchs fame, and Bert Peer, probably the greatest winger ever to play in England.

For 22 years the Racers remained an internationally known name in ice hockey. They defeated the might of Russia and Canada. They were English National League Champions in 1937-38 and 1948-49, British National League Champions in 1954-55, English Autumn Cup Winners in 1947-48, 1949-50 and 1952-53, and British Autumn Cup Winners in 1954-55.

This was by far MK's best performance to date. This player started playing double-shifts, between line two and three, as Coventry exploited the rules, he scored against the less experienced line, ultimately giving Coventry a disputed victory.

MK never gave up, and almost got the equaliser they deserved in the last few minutes, but it was not to be. The final score did not do justice to the effort from the MK boys!!

u12 Southern A League - Saturday 19th October

Milton Keynes vs. Romford

Romford are strong contenders for the A league title this year, and arrived at Planet Ice with a 100% record. Icing only two full lines, and packed with experienced u13 conference players, they were always going to prove a handful for Milton Keynes' younger and less experienced players. As a consequence this MK defeat surprised nobody, but the manner of Romford's victory, and their excessively physical approach to the game left them with few admirers.

The match started evenly with Milton Keynes keeping the bulk of the possession, but it soon become clear that Romford have a potent offensive line, and only solid netminding and frantic MK defence kept them at bay. As ever Milton Keynes tried to take the game to the opposition, but over-enthusiasm and an unfortunate defensive slip allowed Romford captain Murnane to take the lead 05:33. Milton Keynes fought back bravely, and exerted good offensive pressure. But Romford, and particularly Murnane, always looked threatening in attack, and it was he who scored Romford's second goal 08:04 unassisted. The remainder of the period was a mixture of spirited MK attack, and somewhat reckless defensive work. Romford's scrappy third goal 14:26 was no masterpiece, but came as little surprise with Milton Keynes consistently failing to clear their lines.

Milton Keynes started the second period with great energy, and all lines threatened the Romford net, but just as it looked as though they may be forcing themselves back into the game, confusion in front of the net led to consecutive Romford goals 21:54 & 22:27. At this point many teams would have let their heads drop, but the remainder of the period was dominated by the home team and only muscular Romford defensive work stopped MK finding the net. Unfortunately the confrontational nature of this period of play led to the dismissal of MK's Josh Burgess, and MK had to battle for the final minutes of the period short-handed. Unsurprisingly they responded with some of their best attacking moments of the match.

The final period was marred by an ugly incident resulting in the dismissal of Romford's Restarick with a match ban, and a precautionary trip to hospital for his victim, Jacob Heron. Undeterred Milton Keynes continued with their usual positive approach, and although Romford dominated throughout they were only able to score once more, again Murnan showing his pace and skill to score an exceptional short-handed goal. MK gave considerable ice time to both their second and third lines against a Romford first line hungry for goals. Showing great enthusiasm, and a sensational netminding display by Jake Wilmott-Scriven with eighteen consecutive saves, MK were able to leave the ice with their heads held high.

In balance this was a game that Milton Keynes were unlikely to win. There is no doubt that Romford have the experience and skill to win this league, but it will be no advert for junior hockey if they do. Milton Keynes will do well to consign this unpleasant contest to the past, and look forward to a more engaging contest at Invicta next weekend.

MK Thunder moved from second to last to second from top of the ENHL Southern league table on Saturday when they pulled off a resounding road win over Bracknell Hornets at the John Nike Centre. Thunder went into the game with a very definite plan to pressurise Hornets from the face-off and iced four forward lines to accomplish this backed up by just five defencemen. From the first whistle Thunder played according to the plan with aggressive fore-checking and determined skating to chase the puck down in the opposition's defensive zone. It was the under 19 line of Cram, Conway and Bowers who had the task of getting Thunder on the score sheet first and they came up with the goods in the fifth minute whilst on a powerplay, Conway setting up the move and Cram supplying the pass cross the goal for Bowers to slot home. The same line added the second midway through the first period this time Conway netting the goal assisted by Bowers and Featherstone. 2-0 up at the end of the first and everything was going according to plan with Thunder producing their best hockey of the season so far and they continued into the second period when with only one minute gone an unassisted Aram Todd goal extended the lead to 3-0. Other than a slight hiccup at 24:00 when Bracknell scored a shorthanded goal on a breakaway, Thunder were always in total control of the game keeping Hornets pinned in their defensive zone for long periods. Paul Jamieson restored the three goal lead at 25:40 and less than a minute later Lee Featherstone added the fifth firing home a Keiron Goody pass on a powerplay. Mark Conway scored his second of the evening just before the period break to extend the lead to 6-1 at the break.

The final period saw Thunder back off slightly, as they cruised to an resounding win. Keiron Goody fired home their seventh goal from a narrow angle and comfortably in control Thunder were able to chase netminders for the final ten minutes, Matt Woollard replacing the impressive Mark Woolf between the pipes.

This was probably the best sixty minutes performance by Thunder since they were formed last season and was tactically perfect against a tough team on the road.

Lightning demonstrated that they can fight back when they are down as they eventually saw off their Isle of Wight visitors after being given an early scare on Saturday. With netminder Andy Moffat performing heroics, backed up by some very tight defending, the Isle of Wight hit two goals on the counter attack. This put Lightning behind at the first break for the first time this season at the Thunderdome.

Both goals came from Canadian import David Kozier who shot to the right of Barry Hollyhead after 4mins 32 secs and then made it two in the 15th minute.

For the second goal Kozier broke away, Hollyhead came out of his goal, made the fatal mistake of hesitating and saw the Raiders man round him to shoot into an empty net.

Lightning began to get back on track within two minutes of the restart as Leigh Jamieson put a shot in only to see it come back out to Dean Campbell who planted it in the back of the net.

When Raiders got their third on 30mins 40secs it was against the run of play, Tony Blaize the scorer. Lightning's real revival, goalwise, came when Gary Clarke smashed in a pass from Nick Poole in the 31st minute.

Less than five minutes later Simon Howard fired a bullet from the blueline past a sea of players to level the game at the end of the second period.

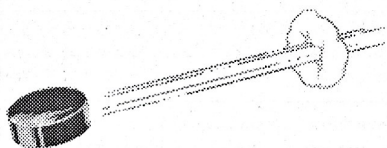
Lightning went ahead when Mikko Skinnari unleashed a shot which came back off the boards behind the goal for Clarke to notch his second with just 1min 25secs gone in the third period. Just over two minutes later Skinnari got on the scoresheet when he broke away to beat Moffat and slotted in.

Thereafter followed a tense 10 minutes – two goal leads in hockey not being secure – before Greg Owen effectively wrapped things up with Lightning's sixth.

However it was not all over as Brad Kenny hit a fourth for Raiders with less than four minutes remaining.

Victory was assured as Clarke completed yet another hat-trick with a one on one goal at 58mins 7secs. And just to make sure Skinnari was on the mark again with 18secs to the buzzer to cap a great fightback by the hosts.

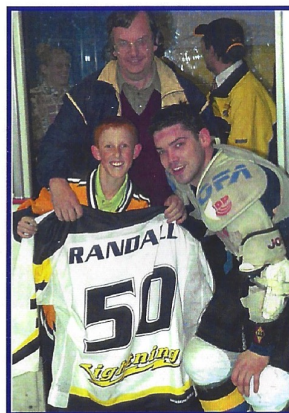

Pound closed fist into open palm of other hand. *Forcing a player into the boards.*



DELAYED PENALTY
Extends arm upwards and points to penalized player. *Penalty called after penalized team gains possession of puck.*



HOLDING
Clasp wrist of the whistle hand with the opposite hand. *Holding an opponent with hands or stick.*



CHARGING
Rotating clenched fists around each other. *A player who runs, jumps or charges an opponent.*



ELBOWS
Taps elbow of the whistle hand with other hand. *Using elbows in any way to foul an opponent.*



HOOKING
Tugging motion with both hands towards chest. *Impeding an opponents progress by hooking with a stick.*



CROSS-CHECKING
A forward and backward motion with both fists. *Cross-checking on opponent with the shaft of the stick.*



HIGH STICKS
Hold both fists clenched one above the other and above head. *Carrying or using stick above shoulder level.*



SLASHING
Chopping motion with one hand over the other. *Impeding progress of an opponent by slashing with a stick.*



INTERFERENCE
Crossed arms in front of the chest. *Impeding progress of an opponent not in possession of the puck.*



ROUGHING
Extends right arm from side with thrust. *Unnecessary roughness on an opponent.*



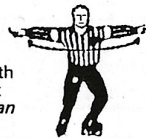
