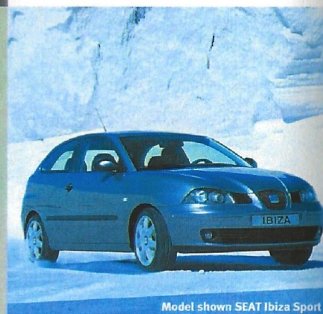

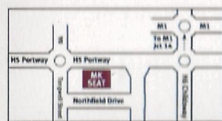

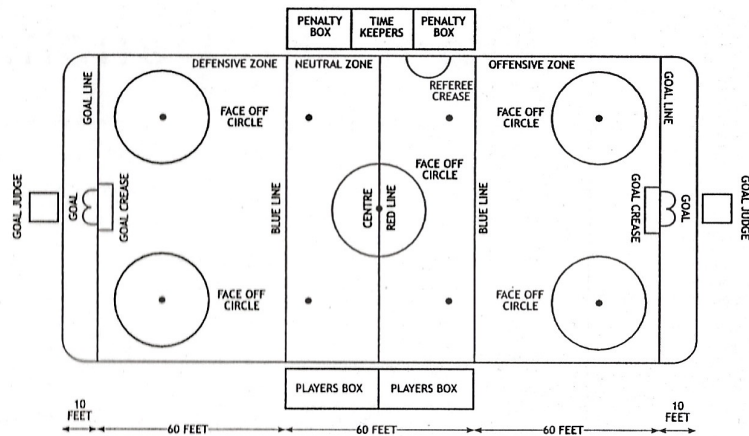

THE ARENA



Game Officials

The referee controls the game. He calls all the penalties and must decide the legality of goals, though sometimes he will call time and ask his linesmen for an opinion before he makes the final decision. The duty of the linesmen is to determine offside and icing. They drop the puck for face offs. They chase the puck after stoppage of play.

Object of the Game

The object is to score goals by putting the puck in the other team's goal whilst making sure that the other team don't do the same to you. Players can hit it in with a stick or deflect it off another player including the goalie.

Rules of the Game

There are only **two** basic rules in ice hockey:

Off Side: When an attacking player crosses the defending team's blue line before the puck he is Off Side. Play is halted and a face-off is held on the nearest spot in the neutral zone.

Icing: If a defending player shoots the puck from his own half past the opposing team's goal line and the puck is next touched by an opposing player, icing is called. Play is halted and the puck is returned to the place where the pass originated.

Duration

The senior game consists of three periods of twenty minutes each. The clock stops with the action.

Scoring

A goal is legal if all of the puck crosses all of the goal-line.

EXCEPTIONS ARE:-

It's not legal however if there is an attacking player in the goal crease who is currently not held by a defender whilst his team mates score.

It is legal to score by kicking providing the puck is deflected off a defenders stick before entering the goal.

No more than two assists can be credited on any goal and these go to the players who handle the puck immediately preceding the goal.

entering the Thunderdome tonight Invicta Dynamos

The Dynamos are largely unchanged this season as they look to hold onto the English Premier League and Playoff double of last season. It is often harder to retain a title than it is to win it and so far this season, Invicta have found that out as they have been having a tough ride. Key losses in players has been a problem, with four players leaving and only two coming in. They have just parted with one of their summer signings, but have added Stuart Low from Romford.

Matt Beveridge #11 – Forward – Import

Has been with the Mo's for a few seasons and is a player who regularly finds the net. Has BNL experience with Paisley Pirates

Was on top form last season as the Mo's almost made a clean sweep of the all the EPNL silverware, winning two out of three trophies.

Junior News

Chelmsford Cherokees vs. MK u10s – Saturday 28th September

MK u10s played their second game of the season away against Chelmsford. With the team all fired up and raring to go, they took the game to Chelmsford from the start. The home side took the lead with a deflected strike, which took the visitors by surprise. Chelmsford started to control the game and added two more goals, before MK got their first goal of the season scored by Jack Bebbington. Chelmsford replied quickly to regain the three goal margin by the break. MK made a spirited effort in the second period, but were denied the goal they deserved as the Cherokees goalie made some great saves. Chelmsford ran out the winners 6-1, but all of the u10s played well, and were still all smiling at the very end.

Bracknell Worker Bees vs. Milton Keynes – Saturday 28th September (Development Challenge Game)

This was a challenge game for the respective development teams from Bracknell and Milton Keynes and included a mixture of players from the u12, u14 and u16 age groups. The game was over 3 periods of 20 minutes – longer than any of the players would play in a league game, but it did give the team, some playing in their first game, very valuable ice time.

MK started steadily, but were rocked when Bracknell went ahead with a shot past the unsighted netminder at 4:06. Within 2 minutes Bracknell went further ahead and the signs were not looking good for MK. At 8:28 MK scored a scrambled goal by Sam Kelley assisted by Matthew Spring. This gave the team a huge boost and the extra confidence was evident when Lewis Randle scored at 10:01 followed by another 5 minutes later, both assisted by Adam Smith. Although Bracknell levelled at 17:32, MK were still competing for everything and went ahead with a Matthew Spring goal just before the first break.

The second period started with MK more than holding their own and when Bracknell equalised at 29:38 they restored the lead through Ian Dennis. It was only one minute later that a well taken goal by Adam Smith put MK 6-4 ahead. As the period continued MK started to run out of steam and conceded 3 goals to finish the period 6-7 down.

Unfortunately the last period followed the same pattern. Although, their pride and spirit managed to drive them forward to net a further 2 goals through Sam Kelley and Joe Goldby (assisted by Jamie Denton and Chris Clifford respectively) the team could not plug all the holes at the back and let in 6 goals to leave the final score 13-8 to Bracknell.

The netminding was split between Rikki Logan and Liam Cusack who faced a total of 57 shots and performed heroics throughout.

In a penalty free match, the team performed admirably and worked really hard together. The enthusiasm and tenacity that they showed, along with their desire to learn, will serve them well in the season ahead.

Lightning maintained their unbeaten home record with the easiest of victories against Haringey Racers on Saturday. The game was effectively over as a contest by the eighth minute. By that stage Lightning had hit the back of the net three times without reply. Almost inevitably it was sniper Gary Clarke who got things moving with a fifth minute goal set up by Nick Poole. Greg Randall was credited with getting the final touch to a Greg Owen effort less than a minute later.

Poole provided the pass for Mikko Skinnari to get the first of his hat-trick in the eighth minute while Racers had Ricky Rutherford in the sin bin for tripping.

The second period began explosively with a brace of Poole goals inside the first minute- both assisted by Clarke and one also assisted by Leigh Jamieson.

Having faced just two shots in the first period netminder Allen Sutton was understandably caught cold when Gary Dodds fired in Racers' only goal just before the 22 minute mark.

A bout of fisticuffs between Michael Knights and Racers' Austin Speni followed with Speni thrown out of the game.

Skinnari then netted, on the powerplay, for the second time to make it 6-1 with defenceman Simon Howard scoring his first for Lightning as he took Poole's pass from the left in the 29th minute.

Poole was the provider when Skinnari rifled in his third goal with under a minute of the third session gone. Youngster Mark Krater then got in on the act with a 47th minute goal created by Dean Campbell.

Moments later two incidents of fighting lived up the game with Campbell engaging with Brian Clarke and Geoff O'Hara mixing it with Dave Richards - the Racers' Clarke becoming the second man on his team to be despatched to the locker room on a five plus game penalty for spearing.

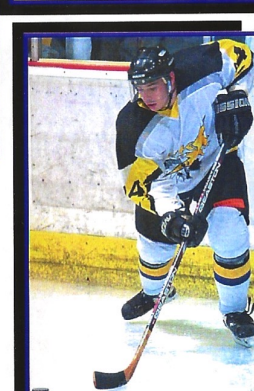
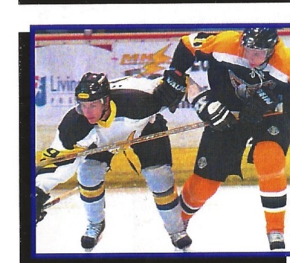
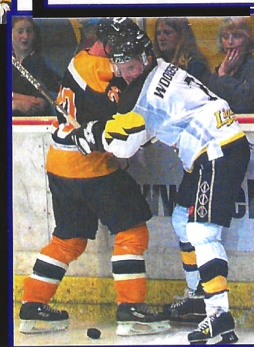
By the time Randall and Owen scored the 10th and 11th goals Racers looked to have given up the fight. Lightning will certainly be looking forward to tougher games than this one.

OFFICIAL REFEREE'S SIGNALS



BOARDING
Pound closed fist into open palm of other hand. *Forcing a player into the boards.*



DELAYED PENALTY
Extends arm upwards and points to penalized player. *Penalty called after penalized team gains possession of puck.*



HOLDING
Clasp wrist of the whistle hand with the opposite hand. *Holding an opponent with hands or stick.*



CHARGING
Rotating clenched fists around each other. *A player who runs, jumps or charges an opponent.*



ELBOWS
Taps elbow of the whistle hand with other hand. *Using elbows in any way to foul an opponent.*



HOOKING
Tugging motion with both hands towards chest. *Impeding an opponents progress by hooking with a stick.*



CROSS-CHECKING
A forward and backward motion with both fists. *Cross-checking on opponent with the shaft of the stick.*



HIGH STICKS
Hold both fists clenched one above the other and above head. *Carrying or using stick above shoulder level.*



SLASHING
Chopping motion with one hand over the other. *Impeding progress of an opponent by slashing with a stick.*



INTERFERENCE
Crossed arms in front of the chest. *Impeding progress of an opponent not in possession of the puck.*



ROUGHING
Extends right arm from side with thrust. *Unnecessary roughness on an opponent.*



TRIPPING
Strike right leg with right hand below the knee. *Tripping an opponent with stick, knee, foot, arm or elbow.*



MISCONDUCT
Both hands on hips. *Continued misconduct after warning.*



SPEARING
Jabbing motion with both hands in front of body. *Spearling an opponent with the stick blade, or attempting to.*



WASH OUT
Both arms swing laterally across body palms down. *Goal disallowed or no offside after delay call.*



TIME-OUT
Use both hands to form a T in front of the chest.



ICING
Linesman's arms folded across the upper chest.



KNEEING
Slapped the knee with palm of hand. *Called when using knee to impede opponent.*
