

THE ARENA



Game Officials

The referee controls the game. He calls all the penalities and must decide the legality of goals, though sometimes he will call time and ask his linesmen for an opinion before he makes the final decision. The duty of the linesmen is to determine offside and icing. They drop the puck for face offs. They chase the puck after stoppage of play.

Object of the Game

The object is to score goals by putting the puck in the other team's goal whilst making sure that the other team don't do the same to you. Players can hit it in with a stick or deflect it off another player including the goalie.

Rules of the Game

There are only **two** basic rules in ice hockey: *Off Side*: When an attacking player crosses the defending team's blue line before the puck he is *Off Side*. Play is halted and a face-off is held on the nearest spot in the neutral zone.

lcing: If a defending player shoots the puck from his own half past the opposing team's goal line and the puck is next touched by an opposing player, icing is called. Play is halted and the puck is returned to the place where the pass originated.

Duration

The senior game consists of three periods of twenty minutes each. The clock stops with the action.

Scoring

A goal is legal if all of the puck crosses all of the goal-line.

EXCEPTIONS ARE:-

It's not legal however if there is an attacking player in the goal crease who is currently not held by a defender whilst his team mates score.

It is legal to score by kicking providing the puck is deflected off a defenders stick before entering the goal.

No more than two assists can be credited on any goal and these go to the players who handle the puck immediately preceding the aoal.


Lightning riding high.....

Following an unbeaten first weekend, the MK Lightning went one step further to claim maximum points from week two. After being held to a draw by Romford last Saturday, the Lightning were eager to record their first victory at the Thunderdome, as they took on the Chelmsford Chieftains, who had coincidentally beaten Romford the previous Sunday.

The fans had to wait until midway through the first period before 3 goals in the space of 3 minutes sent Lightning on their way. The first two came on a powerplay and were both claimed by Greg Owen. Captain Dwayne Newman then gave the first part of his Man of the Match performance by adding the third. Chelmsford had pulled it back after the break when Kyle Amyotte cut the difference to 1 goal. The Lightning then proved their ability, as they have on a number of occasions this season, to lift the play a notch when needed and they did just that as they blew Chelmsford away with 3 goals in less than 2 minutes answered by only one from Chelmsford. The goals came from Greg Randall and Nick Poole (2).

However, the never- say- die attitude of teams in the EPL means that Lightning must tighten up the defence, as running up a lead hasn't seemed to kill the opposition off. Chelmsford were the perfect example as they scored 2 quick goals at the beginning of the 3rd period. The Lightning's cause was not helped by the ejection of two-experienced defensemen in Dwayne Newman and Michael Knights. Newman received 5 minutes plus game for fighting, while Knights was given a 10-minute misconduct for arguing with an official. Goals from Mikko Skinnari and Gary Clarke restored a 3 goal lead but 2 more from Chelmsford in the final minutes gave the Lightning a late scare.

Coach Nick Poole's defensive problems were given a major boost by the news that defenders Simon Howard and Leigh Jamieson should be fit to return this coming weekend, as they recover from a gashed leg and broken wrist respectively. Poole said however, "Due to the current injuries, our defensive staff has been cut in half, so it is up to the forwards to take up the slack. Good defence is played at both ends of the ice".

Racers though showed their own fighting spirit as the Lightning sat back and let the home team pull back two goals and go into the first period break level.







ELBOWS Taps elbow of the whistle hand with other hand. Using elbows in any way to foul an opponent.



HOOKING Tugging motion with both hands towards chest. Impeding an opponents progress by hooking with a stick.



CROSS-CHECKING A forward and backward motion with both fists. Cross-checking on opponent with the shaft of the stick.



HIGH STICKS Hold both fists clenched one above the other and above head. Carrying or using stick above shoulder level.



SLASHING Chopping motion with one hand over the other. Impeding progress of an opponent by slashing with a stick.



INTERFERENCE Crossed arms in front of the chest. Impeding progress of an opponent not in possession of the puck.



ROUGHING Extends right arm from side with thrust. Unnecessary roughness on an


