
Once again, thanks for your support, and enjoy what should be an excellent game of hockey.

## THE ARENA



#### Game Officials

The referee controls the game. He calls all the penalities and must decide the legality of goals, though sometimes he will call time and ask his linesmen for an opinion before he makes the final decision. The duty of the linesmen is to determine offside and icing. They drop the puck for face offs. They chase the puck after stoppage of play.

#### Where is the Game played?

The game takes place in the 'rink' which is approximately 200 feet long by 85 feet wide and is made of water, frozen on top of concrete, producing the ice surface. The arena has rounded corners.

#### What are all the lines painted on the Ice for?

The red line shows the centre of the ice and regulates how far the players can shoot and pass.

The blue lines split the rink into zones. The zone behind your own team's blue line is your defending zone and behind the other team's blue line is your attacking zone. The bit in the middle is the neutral Zone.

#### And the circles?

These are the face-off circles. Two just in front of and either side of each goal and one in the middle. These are where play starts and restarts after an interruption in play. Play always starts in the middle, but where it restarts, depends on what has happened in the play.

#### The Players.

There are six players for each team on the ice at any one time. Those six players will keep on changing throughout the game. Who is on the ice at any one time is a complex business which is determined by each teams coach.

#### There are 3 types of player:

Three forwards, who line up at the front and are in charge of offensive play i.e. trying to score goals. They are known as, Left Wing, Centre and Right Wing.

Two defencemen, one on the right and one on the left who try to prevent the other team scoring. One Goaltender or Goalie, or Netminder.

#### How Long Does a Game Last?

There are 3 periods of 20 minutes each but each time that play is interrupted the clock is stopped which means that each period can go on a lot longer than 20 minutes. There is a 15 minute break between each period.

# Swindon Lynx

Swindon 'Innogy' Lynx have a familiar look about them this season, although last season's leading scorer, Merv Priest has taken over the coaching reigns from Bryan Larkin. Lynx lost three of last seasons imports during the summer, with both Larkin and Sean Tarr retiring, and Jani Eskola returning to Scandinavia.

Lynx have made changes to their roster, after losing key imports and Brits, but have found suitable replacements, as they look to regain the title they won the season before last. Swindon continue the policy of utilising the young talent coming through their junior development system.

#### Ones to Watch:

#### Mark McCoy #24 - Defence - Import

McCoy originally from Prince Rupert, British Columbia joined the Lynx this season, and has a wealth of North American and European experience.

Mark first made a name for himself with the Swift-Current Broncos in the WHL, and played for several teams in the WHL, before a brief spell with the Tulsa Oilers. McCoy made his UK debut with the Basingstoke Bison during the 95/96 season, before moving on to play in the Austrian League with Vienna. At the start of the 97/98 season he was drafted by Superleague Newcastle Vipers, but returned to North America to see out the season with the Toledo Storm. Mark was back in the UK during 1998, splitting his time between Guildford Flames and Kingston Hawks.

#### Rob Lamey #5 – Forward – British

Lamey began his hockey career within the junior set up at Romford, before moving to Guildford. With Guildford, he was on the winning u16 team at the British Junior Championships. He made his senior debut with the Flames in 1996, and was part of Guildford's most successful team during 2000/01, when they won the FNBL League, Playoffs and NTL Cup. He began last season with the Flames, but moved on to Basingstoke early in the season.

Last seasons stats: FBNL (GP) 35 5+15= 20 6 PiMs.

#### Robin Davison #12 - Forward - British

The prolific scoring Davison hails from Durham and started his hockey career with the north eastern club

He then moved on to play for Blackburn and Telford, before joining Swindon in 1995. Robin has lived in the town ever since, and apart from brief spells at Guildford and Oxford, has played for Swindon's various Link Centre based teams for the past seven years. During that period, he has been the leading British scorer on the roster.

#### Milton Keynes (3) vs. Guildford Fireflies (3)

Milton Keynes welcomed old adversaries Guildford to Planet Ice. Previous encounters have taken on epic proportions, and with only one point separating the two sides in the table, this was guaranteed to be a close-fought contest.

Milton Keynes started sluggishly, and although holding the bulk of possession, they lacked their usual bite on both lines. Guildford soon began to dominate, and only good work by netminder Wilmott-Scriven kept them from taking an early lead. As the period progressed, the visitors were increasingly allowed to control the puck, and after a series of diciplined passing moves, they breached the MK defence at 07:55 to take the lead. Guildford stepped up the pace, and after a sustained period of attacking pressure, MK conceded a penalty, the visitors lengthening their lead during the resulting power play (09:36). Sensing more goals Guildford continued to press, and despite better resistance by the MK defence, a third goal at 11:43 came as no surprise. The period ended with more Guildford pressure, but signs of MK resistance, particularly in defence, kept the visitors at bay. MK were still in the game, but only just...

The second period began well for MK, and their attacks began to show more promise, but Guildford still had the upper hand. Continuing to press for goals they met stern disciplined defence from the hosts, and slowly the balance of the match began to turn. After exceptional work from Peussa, having possibly his best match of the season, Trivett picked up his pass and fired home MK's first goal of the game at 19:45. Now the adrenalin started to pump, and Guildford were forced to defend desperately against continued MK attacks. In defence MK were confident and the visitors seemed increasingly unlikely to extend their lead. By the end of the period it was all MK, and although still conceding a two-goal deficit the hosts looked hungrier for the game than their adversaries. The final period showed MK at their very best; the defence showing good discipline and energy, the forwards demonstrating their pace and skill in attack. An early goal was needed and after a pass from Heron, Nicklin scored a determined effort to set the game up for its inevitable finale! MK pressed hard for the equalizer, and now it was Guildford's turn to look lacklustre. After sustained MK pressure, Cox finally slipped clear of his Guildford shadows, and slotted home clinically to level the match at 39:48. The final five minutes of the match witnessed frantic attacking hockey from both sides, and although Wilmott-Scriven saved well, it seemed that MK would finally prevail. But this time the fairy tale was denied them, and despite desperate attempts to break the deadlock, including one astonishing MK effort in the dying seconds of the match, the contest ended all square. Another nerve-wracking encounter for players and spectators alike, and probably the fairest result. For Milton Keynes, most satisfaction must come from their polished defensive work in the final two periods of the match, and it was no surprise for two defencemen to be nominated for the match awards. With Goodman settling down well in his new defensive role, the future prospects look bright for this young team. A return trip to Guildford next week will be no stroll, but if the boys show the energy and commitment they showed today, then they can expect to come away with more than a single point.

Milton Keynes Storm Under 19s enjoyed their first home win of the season after battling through one of the most physical encounters they have had all year. In a game which saw MK suffer from a rash of minor and major penalties, the home side put on a great defensive display combined with some excellent work in front of the net to leave the visitors the losers for the second time.

The first period opened slowly - MK pinned down in their own zone, finding it hard to gain any ice on the Fen Tigers. Some over confidence bolstered by Peterbrough's short bench and MK's previous win at Peterborough saw them go O-1 down at just 5:21. Piling on the pressure, MK increased their workrate, and took the game to the visitors, equalizing at 13:08 - Ross Bowers taking solo honours. Milton Keynes then gained the upper hand for the first time in the game as Ben Williams set up David Benjamin, perfectly positioned in front of net. MK's Mark Conway, now well known and always a 'popular' target, was a victim of a bad check off the puck - out of sight of the referees and was carried off the ice to sit out the remainder of the game.

In the second period, MK came under severe pressure, and took a lot of niggly penalties; mostly in retaliation to constant sniping from the Peterborough players, somehow overlooked by the referees in the heat of the game. Peterborough equalised at 24:02 and despite numerous scoring opportunities, MK couldnt quite find the back of the net in that period.

In the third period, MK turned up the pressure and took the game to another level, leaving Peterborough's short bench reeling as Ross Bowers scored two short handed goals. Then MK's defender Matt Roberts took his second 2+10 of the game and was given a game misconduct. The fourth goal was on a breakway, and caught the Peterbrough defense napping. With eight minutes left, MK shut up shop, and despite one more penalty, managed to hold their own, even short handed, to win the game 4-2.







## Match report...... Match report...... Lightning vs. Raiders – Saturday 16th November

Clarke 3+1, Owen 3+0, Poole 1+2, Skinnari O+3, Newman O+2, Jamieson & Campbell O+1 Nets: Hollyhead 31/3 (87.10%)

Lightning at last gained some revenge on their Essex rivals after two defeats at the Rom Valley Way. The four goal margin between the two sides could have been even greater had Lightning not lost their focus in the final quarter of an hour.

The hosts led 7-1 at the second break and although Raiders managed to add two goals in the last session Lightning were never in danger of losing.

Almost inevitably it was the Gary Clarke-Nick Poole combination that got Lightning off the mark, short-handed, just before the six minute mark while Leigh Jamieson was serving time for interference. Clarke played a one-two with Poole, receiving the puck back to fire in a long range rocket shot. Ninety seconds later Poole was again the provider, this time with a pass which Clarke shot home.

In the 13th minute Clarke threaded the puck through to Poole under pressure. The player coach turned and fired in past netminder Mathieu Davidge.

Raiders finally got on the scoresheet with a powerplay goal from Danny Marshall, while Poole was in the box for charging. Noel Burkitt played the puck to Marshall who found a gap past unsighted Barry Hollyhead.

The three goal advantage was restored as Lightning hit a powerplay goal of their own before the first interval. Dwayne Newman shot towards goal where Greg Owen's quick reactions turned the puck into the net. In the second period Raiders turned up the pressure, but to no effect and it was Lightning who scored with a five on three advantage when Newman touched on a Mikko Skinnari pass to Clarke to complete his hat-trick.

Owen got Lightning's sixth with a scrambled effort in 37th minute. But there no doubting the quality of Owen's hat-trick goal just over two minutes later—collecting Skinnari's pass and hitting it first time past Davidge.

The third period was disappointing for home fans expecting more goals from their heroes. Instead it was Raiders who staged a fightback, albeit rather late. Marshall converted Jamie Randall's set up in the 46th minute to make it 7-2.

Then while the home side were a man short due to a bench minor for delaying the game, Rob Douglas found Burkitt to shoot home. However there was some dispute from the Lightning players who claimed, unsuccessfully, that the puck had been handled immediately before Burkitt's shot.

However this was all that Raiders could manage as Lightning claimed the points to stay top of the league.

Invicta's only game of the weekend saw them come back from a two goal deficit to earn a draw against Milton Keynes Lightning.

MK came under Mo's pressure from the start, with the first chance coming Dynamos way at 03:20, when Duane Ward took the puck all the way around the Lightning goal, to setting up Andrews, only to see the shot saved. Mo's had another chance shortly after, but Andrews shot was once again saved. MK broke away from defence, but their 2 on 1 chance was thwarted by Mo's defence. Skinnari scored the games first goal, when he stole the puck from the Mo's defence and stuck it in the net. MK nearly went two ahead, when Poole broke away, but Van der Velden pulled off the save to deny him.





# **OFFICIAL REFEREE'S SIGNALS**



BOARDING Pound closed fist into open palm of other hand. Forcing a player into the boards.



DELAYED PENALTY Extends arm upwards and points to penalized player. Penalty called after penalized team gains possession of puck.



HOLDING Clasp wrist of the whistle hand with the opposite hand. Holding an opponent with hands or stick.



CHARGING
Rotating clenched
fists around each
other. A player who
runs, jumps or
charges an
opponent.



ELBOWS
Taps elbow of the whistle hand with other hand.
Using elbows in any way to foul an opponent.



HOOKING Tugging motion with both hands towards chest. Impeding an opponents progress by hooking with a stick.



CROSS-CHECKING A forward and backward motion with both fists. Cross-checking on opponent with the shaft of the stick.



HIGH STICKS
Hold both fists
clenched one above
the other and above
head. Carrying or
using stick above
shoulder level.



SLASHING Chopping motion with one hand over the other. Impeding progress of an opponent by slashing with a stick.



INTERFERENCE Crossed arms in front of the chest. Impeding progress of an opponent not in possession of the puck.



ROUGHING Extends right arm from side with thrust. Unnecessary roughness on an opponent.



TRIPPING Strike right leg with right hand below the knee. Tripping an opponent with stick, knee, foot, arm or elbow.



MISCONDUCT Both hands on hips. Continued misconduct after warning.



SPEARING
Jabbing motion with
both hands in front
of body. Spearing an
opponent with the
stick blade, or
attempting to.



WASH OUT
Both arms swing laterally across body palms down. Goal disallowed or no offside after delay call.



TIME-OUT Use both hands to form a T in front of the chest.




ICING Linesmans arms folded across the upper chest.
