
Once again thanks for coming, make some noise, and enjoy the game. See you upstairs in the bar afterwards.

THE ARENA



Game Officials

The referee controls the game. He calls all the penalities and must decide the legality of goals, though sometimes he will call time and ask his linesmen for an opinion before he makes the final decision. The duty of the linesmen is to determine offside and icing. They drop the puck for face offs. They chase the puck after stoppage of play.

Object of the Game

The object is to score goals by putting the puck in the other team's goal whilet making sure that the other team don't do the same to you. Players can hit it in with a stick or deflect it off another player including the goalie.

Rules of the Game

There are only **two** basic rules in ice hockey: Off Side: When an attacking player crosses the defending team's blue line before the puck he is Off Side. Play is halted and a face-off is held on the nearest spot in the neutral zone.

Icing: If a defending player shoots the puck from his own half past the opposing team's goal line and the puck is next touched by an opposing player, icing is called. Play is halted and the puck is returned to the place where the pass originated.

Duration

The senior game consists of three periods of twenty minutes each. The clock stops with the action.

Scoring

A goal is legal if all of the puck crosses all of the goal-line.

EXCEPTIONS ARE:-

It's not legal however if there is an attacking player in the goal crease who is currently not held by a defender whilst his team mates score.

It is legal to score by kicking providing the puck is deflected off a defenders stick before entering the goal.

No more than two assists can be credited on any goal and these go to the players who handle the puck immediately preceding the goal.

Chelmsford Chieftains

Milton Keynes vs. Slough Hurricanes

Milton Keynes were handed a stark defensive lesson by a well-disciplined Slough side. Despite dominating possession throughout the match, and outshooting the eventual winners by 16-11, Milton Keynes were unable to find the back of the net. Slough consistently protected their outstanding netminder in numbers, and were happy to soak up Milton Keynes pressure with increasing ease, allowing swift breakaways as their only form of attack.

The match started with great promise, with quick handling and skating by Cox, Trivett & Peussa in particular looking certain to crack the Slough defense. Only exceptional work by netminder West kept Slough in the game. As the period progressed MK advanced in waves, confident of extending their 100% start to the season, and Slough hung on grimly. It seemed that one MK goal would be the key to several more, and MK poured men over the blue line in a bid to break the deadlock. Eventually this commitment to attack was their undoing, and Slough scored a breakaway first goal on 15:40. Undaunted MK threw themselves back at the Slough crease, but as the half-time buzzer sounded, Slough held a surprise 0-1 lead.

The second period started in much the same fashion, as did Slough's second goal at 23:45, another simple breakaway. MK responded with good heart and continued to dominate possession, but Slough's defense continually smothered every offensive move on goal. As the minutes ticked away, frustration set in and MK's passing game was abandoned for increasingly unlikely solo efforts on goal. When Slough scored their third, a powerplay at 38:53 (and the only penalty of the entire match), the game was already lost.

After the drama of Swindon a fortnight ago, this was undoubtedly a frustrating afternoon, but this is a highly competitive league, and there will be few easy games. One thing for certain is that this is a team of exceptional spirit and self-belief. As long as they learn essential lessons from games like this, another highly successful season awaits them.







...... ten-minute storm devastates the Mighty Mo's

Dynamos were caught under an avalanche of shots, from the first drop of the puck, as Milton Keynes set up camp in the Mo's zone. With the game just two minutes old, a Greg Owen strike, assisted by Michael Knights got Lightning off to a flying start. MK's second goal came just under a minute later through Gary Clarke, assisted by Nick Poole.

Whilst the shots continued thick and fast on Dynamos net, the referee became the victim of the biggest hit of the night, after an accidental collision with Peter Korff.

Thankfully, the referee was soon back on his feet and the game restarted. This stoppage was not enough to put MK off their game, Gary Clarke scored again at 04:59, with Nick Poole and Mikko Skinnari bagging the assists. Fourteen seconds later and Clarke completed his hat-trick, this time assisted by Poole and Newman. Lightning's fifth came at 06:11, as Mark Krater fired the puck home, assisted by Campbell and Wooderson.

Looking at the wrong end of 5-O scoreline inside seven minutes, Dynamos coach Greenhous called a timeout, to try to regain some composure.

MK continued to rain shots on van der Velden, with the sixth goal coming at 09:49, again from Mark Krater, assisted once more by Dean Campbell and Phil Wooderson.

At 13.39, Duane Ward combined with Jake French and Paul Hume to score Invicta's only goal of the night. The game then continued in the same vein, with a barrage of shots coming from the Lightning. 17:41 saw the first penalties of the night, following a brief melee, both Wales and Knights sat two minutes each, for slashing and roughing respectively. At 18:20 Invicta lost the services of Duane Ward for a check from behind on Simon Howard.


Lightning eased to the first break, leading 6-1.

The second period saw Invicta without the services of Matt Beveridge, through a back injury, reducing their bench further. The game looked a little more even, as Invicta rallied together to trying to limit the damage. At 23:52 MK added their seventh, with Mark Conway scoring his first senior goal, assisted by Greg Owen and Michael Knights.

Invicta tried to fight back with shots coming from Wales and French, but Holyhead was equal to their efforts. Both sides had further opportunities, but Mo's Ward came the closest, before the second period ended with Lightning extending their advantage to 7-1.

With the result settled, both sides gave more ice time to their youngster players.

The period passed without major incident until 52.00, when Sean Clement was called for holding the opponents stick. The resulting powerplay saw Owen score unassisted at 53:48, and this was the last goal of the night.



Lightning shot down by Jets.....

A top of the table clash saw the Lightning take their impressive record to face Slough, who themselves came into the game on a 5 game winning streak. An early interference penalty to Norman Pinnington, enabled the Lightning take the lead when Nick Poole found the back of the net at 05:19. Although this was the only goal of the period, the remainder was not without action, as both teams came close to scoring. Six minutes into the second period, Slough were back on level terms through Matt Sirman, assisted by Dave Heath and Norman Pinnington. Right at the end of the 26th minute an incident broke out which saw Matt Foord miss most of the remainder of the period, receiving 2+10 for checking from behind and also Geoff O'Hara receive 2 minutes for cross checking and a further 2 minutes for roughing. Slough converted the powerplay with a skilful goal from Pinnington at 27:14, but their lead lasted only two minutes before Gary Clarke scored on a Milton Keynes powerplay. Sirman's second at 33:16 put Slough back in front, before a four minute powerplay conceded by Milton Keynes proved too much to nullify. Sirman completed his hat-trick during the second half of the powerplay at 38:35, to give Slough a commanding 4-2 lead.

The third period saw some excellent hockey played, as the Lightning pushed hard to equalise. Lightning kept their hopes alive with a Greg Owen goal at 50:04 to pull the deficit back to one goal, before defending two penalties well. Barry Hollyhead left the net at 59:30, but Slough defended the 30 seconds of 6 on 5 and took full points. Coach Nick Poole later stated his disappointment in the result, but was pleased by the improvement in commitment. "Had we have put away a few more of our chances early on, the game could have been over within 20 minutes, but it shows just how challenging the ENPL will be this year". 

ELBOWS
Taps elbow of the whistle hand with other hand.
Using elbows in any way to foul an opponent.



HOOKING
Tugging motion with
both hands towards
chest. Impeding an
opponents progress by
hooking with a stick.



CROSS-CHECKING A forward and backward motion with both fists. Cross-checking on opponent with the shaft of the stick.



HIGH STICKS
Hold both fists
clenched one above
the other and above
head. Carrying or
using stick above
shoulder level.



SLASHING Chopping motion with one hand over the other. Impeding progress of an opponent by slashing with a stick.



INTERFERENCE Crossed arms in front of the chest. Impeding progress of an opponent not in possession of the puck.



ROUGHING Extends right arm from side with thrust. Unnecessary roughness on an opponent.



TRIPPING Strike right leg with right hand below the knee. Tripping an opponent with stick, knee, foot, arm or elbow.



MISCONDUCT Both hands on hips. Continued misconduct after warning.

Jabbing motion with
both hands in front
of body. Spearing an
opponent with the
stick blade, or
attempting to.



WASH OUT
Both arms swing laterally across body palms down. Goal disallowed or no offside after delay call.



TIME-OUT Use both hands to form a T in front of the chest.



ICING Linesmans arms folded across the upper chest.



KNEEING Slapped the knee with palm of hand. Called when using knee to impede opponent.


