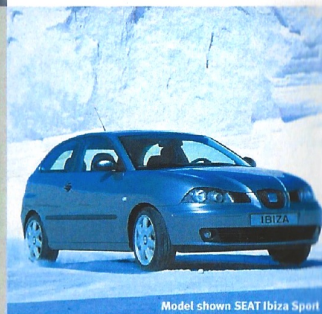

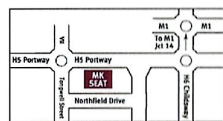

Once again enjoy tonight's match. Keep it loud and lets stay unbeaten at the 'Thunderdome'.

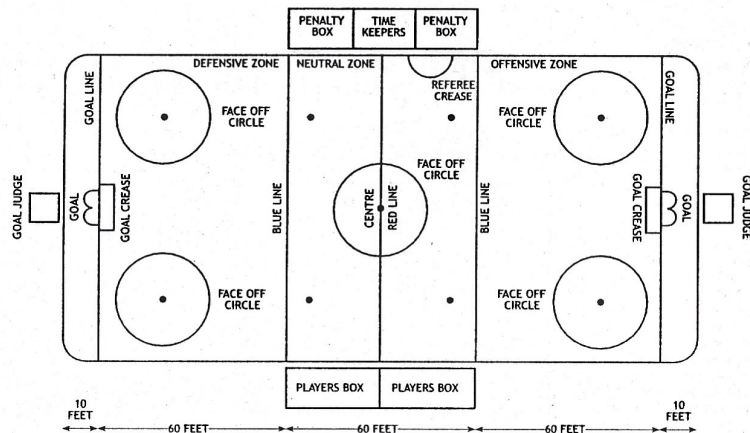

## THE ARENA



### Game Officials

The referee controls the game. He calls all the penalties and must decide the legality of goals, though sometimes he will call time and ask his linesmen for an opinion before he makes the final decision. The duty of the linesmen is to determine offside and icing. They drop the puck for face offs. They chase the puck after stoppage of play.

### Object of the Game

The object is to score goals by putting the puck in the other team's goal whilst making sure that the other team don't do the same to you. Players can hit it in with a stick or deflect it off another player including the goalie.

### Rules of the Game

There are only **two** basic rules in ice hockey:

**Off Side:** When an attacking player crosses the defending team's blue line before the puck he is Off Side. Play is halted and a face-off is held on the nearest spot in the neutral zone.

**Icing:** If a defending player shoots the puck from his own half past the opposing team's goal line and the puck is next touched by an opposing player, icing is called. Play is halted and the puck is returned to the place where the pass originated.

### Duration

The senior game consists of three periods of twenty minutes each. The clock stops with the action.

### Scoring

A goal is legal if all of the puck crosses all of the goal-line.

EXCEPTIONS ARE:-

It's not legal however if there is an attacking player in the goal crease who is currently not held by a defender whilst his team mates score.

It is legal to score by kicking providing the puck is deflected off a defenders stick before entering the goal.

No more than two assists can be credited on any goal and these go to the players who handle the puck immediately preceding the goal.

## entering the Thunderdome tonight Isle of Wight Raiders

This season the Raiders have made a few key changes, the aim being to return to once dominant force they used to be in the ENPL.

This season, the coaching position has been given to last season's captain Jason Coles, who is assisted by Andy Pickles. Having lost two of last seasons roster to BNL clubs, they have gained players with similar experience. Although they felt the late, controversial departure of Kyle Amyotte to Chelmsford, would cause a problem, they have brought in an adequate replacement in David Kozier. Overall, the Raiders have an experienced, but youthful looking side, and are hoping for a consistent season under the new coaching partnership.

Ones to Watch:

### Andy Moffat #36 – Netminder – British

In Moffat, the Raiders may well have one of the top goalies in this league, and this was fully justified with the recent call up to the Great Britain team. Having joined from Hull last season, this youngster has proved to be a hit with the fans after some heroics between the pipes.

### Brad Kenny #19 – Forward – Import

This former Team Canada soccer player, was persuaded to join the Raiders despite being pursued by several FBNL teams, on the back of a promising season for Canisius College in America. Kenny is described as a good team player with all-round ability that is sure to fit in with any team.

### David Kozier #25 – Forward – Import

Canadian forward Kozier, was the IQW's final signing as a replacement for the departing Amyotte. He arrived in the UK fresh from a full campaign with the highly-regarded Cornell University. Kozier was rated as one of the better two-way players in the league, with good puck control alongside his physical style of play.

### Joe Baird #15 – Forward – British

This former Superleague and Great Britain star, joined the Raiders during the summer alongside team-mate Neil Leary from BNL Basingstoke Bison. An exciting player, who will be looking to make a big impact in this league.

Milton Keynes Thunder and Peterborough Islanders shared the points at the end of a fourteen-goal thriller at the Thunderdome on Sunday. Although the quality of some of the hockey played left a bit to be desired, not helped by some over officiating by the referee, fortunes in the game switched from one team to another resulting in a nail biting finale as Thunder almost got the game winner in the closing seconds.

It was Thunder who had the better of a scrappy first period that never really got going due to the referees' constant use of his whistle. Dan Markham opened the scoring for Thunder on a powerplay when he got in on the blind side of Islanders goal to latch onto an Aram Todd pass across the crease. Todd was back in action a minute later as he found the net himself assisted by Dean Burgin. So all was going according to plan at the end of the first as Thunder took a two goal lead into the second period, but it all went horribly wrong from there!

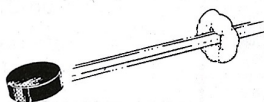

..... Lightning brush aside the Chieftians with ease

Billed as a crunch match between the league leaders and the second in table side, Lightning's encounter with Chelmsford Chieftians failed to live up to those expectations. Most anticipated a closely fought battle but in the event Lightning brushed aside the challenge of the Essex side with a devastating first and second period display to win 8-1. Player coach Nick Poole gave a taste of what was to come as Gary Clarke set him up for the first goal after just 46 seconds.

Five minutes later Mikko Skinnari was the provider as Poole made it 2-0 and the Finn got in on the act himself with the third goal after 15mins 48secs before Greg Owen completed the first session scoring less than two minutes later.

Chieftians came out for the second period determined to press Lightning and their efforts were rewarded when Russell Bishop set up Andrew Power for a long range shot which beat Barry Hollyhead in the 24th minute.

But that only served to spark Lightning back into top gear – in particular Clarke who hit the first of a hat-trick of goals inside four minutes at 28mins 50secs when he beat netminder Chris Douglas one on one from Poole's pass.

Poole then passed from behind the net to see Clarke fire a first time shot into the net before Greg Randall supplied the pass which Clarke fired to the right of a sea of players to make it 7-1 at 33mins 2secs.

By this stage Douglas had had enough and he was replaced in between the pipes by Paul Wilcock. But that did not stop Clarke adding one more to his tally with a close range shot just over two minutes into the third period.

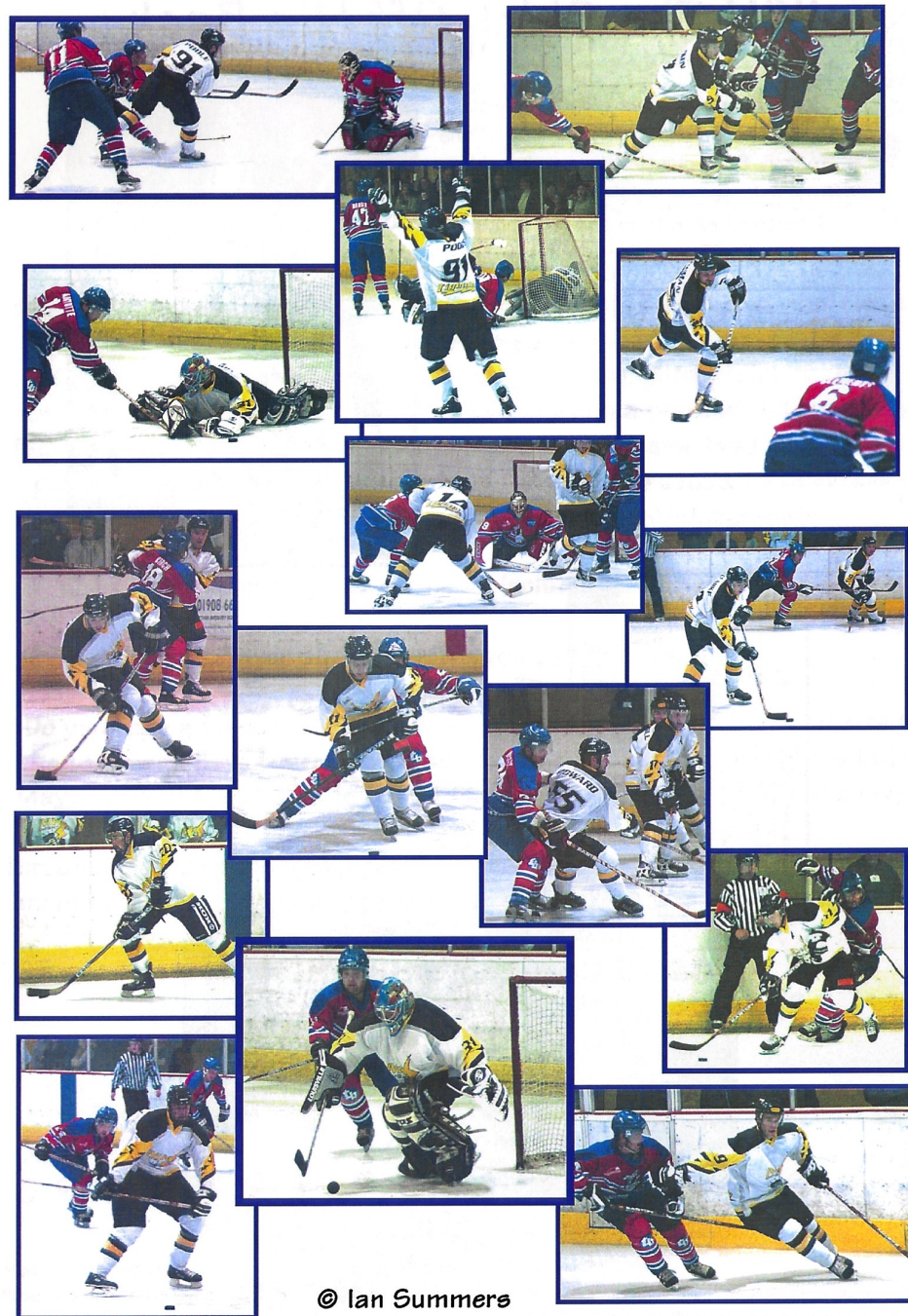
With the game won Lightning eased off the gas for the remainder of the match – having just four shots on goal while restricting Chieftians to six as attention turned to defensive work. The final scoreline meant that Lightning have conceded only five goals in the last five home matches.

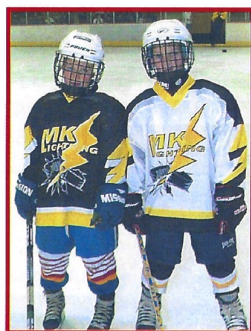
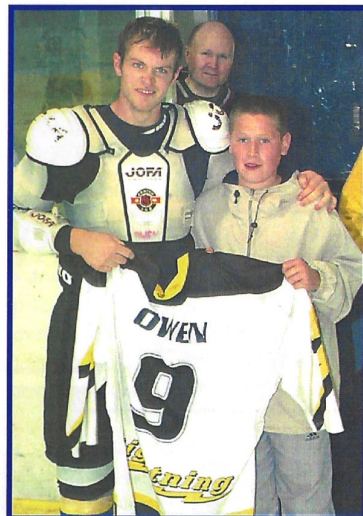

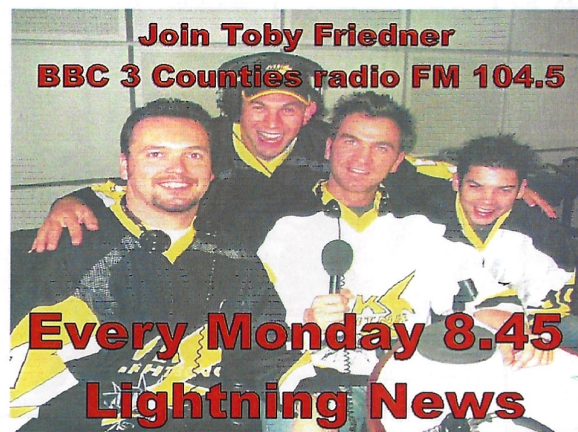

### Wild Foxes v Lightning Sunday 13th October

..... Wild Foxes tamed at home.

Once again a short benched Foxes side faced tough opposition, this time from the league leaders, Milton Keynes Lightning. 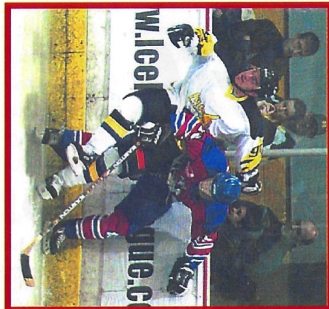
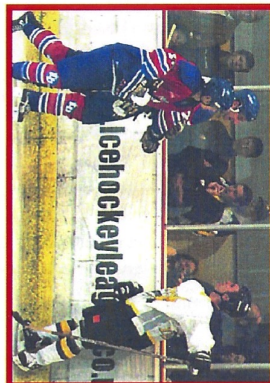

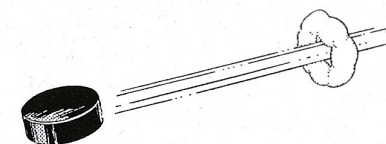

# OFFICIAL REFEREE'S SIGNALS



**BOARDING**  
Pound closed fist into open palm of other hand. *Forcing a player into the boards.*



**DELAYED PENALTY**  
Extends arm upwards and points to penalized player. *Penalty called after penalized team gains possession of puck.*



**HOLDING**  
Clasp wrist of the whistle hand with the opposite hand. *Holding an opponent with hands or stick.*



**CHARGING**  
Rotating clenched fists around each other. *A player who runs, jumps or charges an opponent.*



**ELBOWS**  
Taps elbow of the whistle hand with other hand. *Using elbows in any way to foul an opponent.*



**HOOKING**  
Tugging motion with both hands towards chest. *Impeding an opponents progress by hooking with a stick.*



**CROSS-CHECKING**  
A forward and backward motion with both fists. *Cross-checking on opponent with the shaft of the stick.*



**HIGH STICKS**  
Hold both fists clenched one above the other and above head. *Carrying or using stick above shoulder level.*



**SLASHING**  
Chopping motion with one hand over the other. *Impeding progress of an opponent by slashing with a stick.*



**INTERFERENCE**  
Crossed arms in front of the chest. *Impeding progress of an opponent not in possession of the puck.*



**ROUGHING**  
Extends right arm from side with thrust. *Unnecessary roughness on an opponent.*



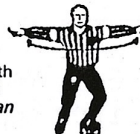
**TRIPPING**  
Strike right leg with right hand below the knee. *Tripping an opponent with stick, knee, foot, arm or elbow.*



**MISCONDUCT**  
Both hands on hips. *Continued misconduct after warning.*



**SPEARING**  
Jabbing motion with both hands in front of body. *Spearing an opponent with the stick blade, or attempting to.*



**WASH OUT**  
Both arms swing laterally across body palms down. *Goal disallowed or no offside after delay call.*



**TIME-OUT**  
Use both hands to form a T in front of the chest.



**ICING**  
Linesmans arms folded across the upper chest.



**KNEEING**  
Slapped the knee with palm of hand. *Called when using knee to impede opponent.*
